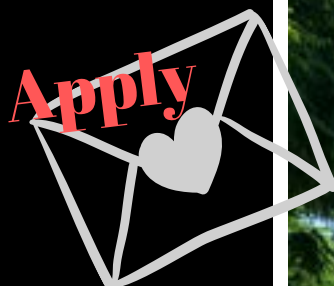
Short term ESC in ecology

Project details:

This short-term ESC project enables volunteers to participate in our organization's activities and cooperate with other institutions in order to organize local events. The project will take place in the town of Kazanlak (Bulgaria) and Srednogorovo village. It will be dealing with:

- Carrying out outdoor activities by creating an eco-centre "Green Europe", which will conduct eco-technologies such as composting, upselling, and others. Creating fences from old car tires and sticks, strengthening land masses, mulching, building raised beds, planting different crops, and building a dike.
- Organizing discussions in the local schools focused on ecology.
- Shooting and screening of eco movies.
- Summer camps in the small villages.
- Creating trash art items and other workshops.
- Organizing events with the local community.
- Cleaning nature (collecting trash) in the area.
- Preparation of winter meat (canning).
- Cutting, varnishing.
- Creating houses for homeless dogs in the dog shelter.

Our organization aims to keep you amused in any way and occupy all your senses!

Our project gives an opportunity for young people from different countries to realize their common values by creating different works of art and embody in them their own cultural identities and backgrounds.

Volunteers will appear in the "Wall of Volunteers", an installation to remember the previous projects of the NGO and the volunteers who took part in them.

Volunteers will take part in the publishing process of the local paper journal devoted to the volunteers, "ДоброволциТЕ" ("The Volunteers"), available also on the web in newsletter format.



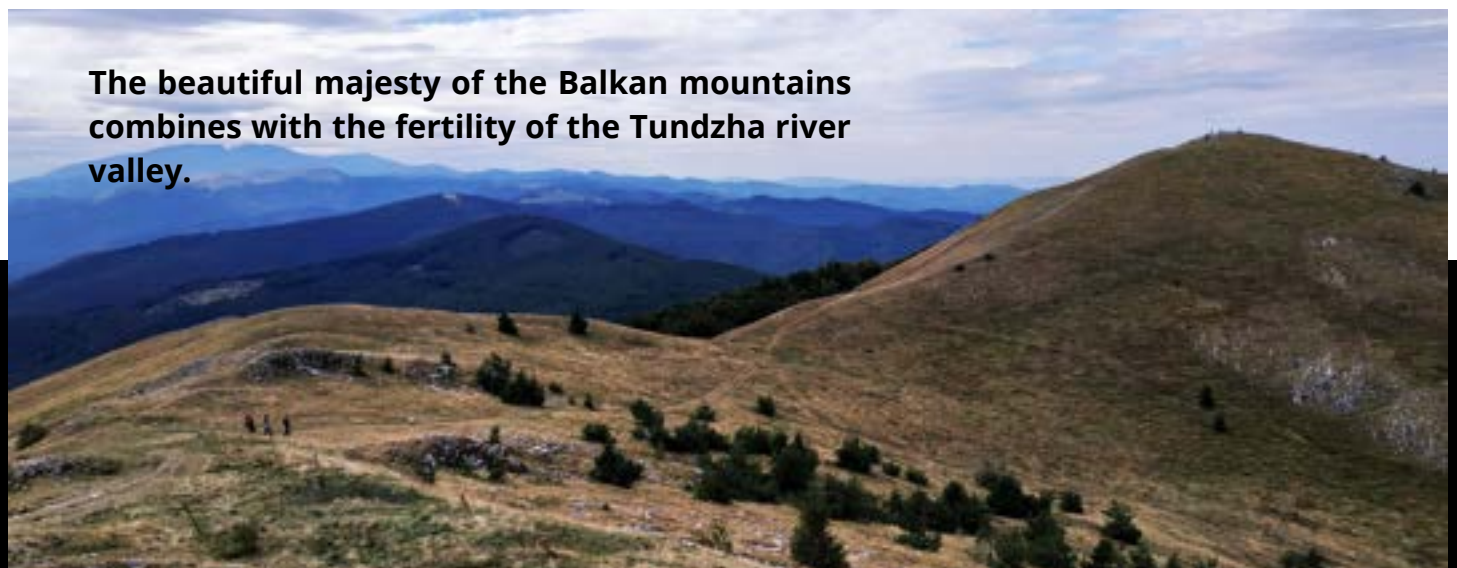
Eco center Green Europe

The organization started to create, the Eco festival at dam lake Koprinka in 2011. After that we move it back to Kazanlak and the village of Koprinka and Srednogorovo. The festival itself was inspired by two volunteers - one from the "Peace Corps" and the second one from Lithuania by EVS program, as a part of the project called "Ecology development" (2011) and continued till today. In order to continue and develop, sustainable and environmental ideas, the organization constructed creating an eco-centre. There we can show, various techniques like an environmentally friendly lifestyle. It will include a lot of demonstrations, workshops, and good practices, in front of kids from the locals in order to build, an ecological way of thinking for the future generation.

The eco center is located in the beautiful village of Srednogorovo near the town of Kazanlak

Damask Rose is one of the most important natural treasures in the region. Kazanlak, the main center for the production of the Bulgarian rose oil (85% of world's total), is famous worldwide thanks to this traditional activity that is several centuries long. Rose-picking lasts for about a month (from May 20 to June 20, depending on weather conditions) and it is part of the popular Rose Festival.

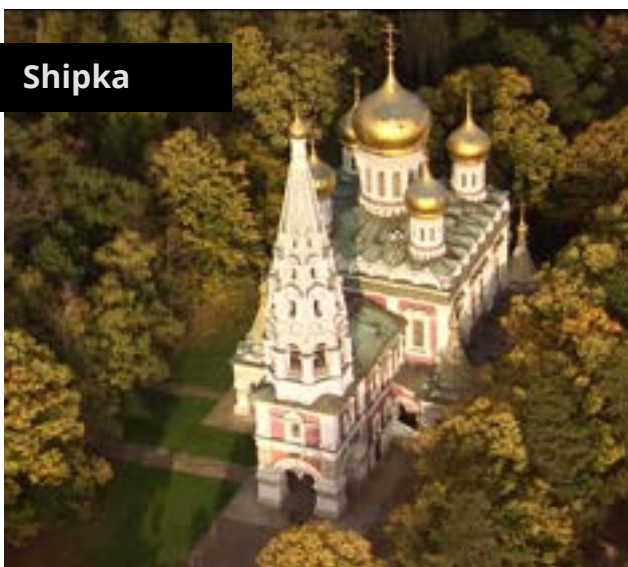


Buzludzha

Kazanlak is among the 15 biggest industrial centers of Bulgaria, also called as city of guns and roses for the Arsenal weapon factory, one of the main employers in the region. The population is around 46.000 people (2016).

Accommodation

The volunteers will be accommodated in the eco-centre in the village of Srednogorovo (13 kilometres away from the city of Kazanlak) where all the volunteers will live together. The house is with one big living room together with a kitchen and 3 rooms. Volunteers will be in rooms 4 people together. There are 1 toilet and 2 bathrooms with toilets in the house.

Travel costs

Travel costs have a limit depending on the volunteer's country (the amount is pre-established and cannot be changed). **Keep all the boarding passes and original tickets from your travel!**

The money will be reimbursed on your bank account after the end of the project, when the volunteers submit all tickets and fill the final report.

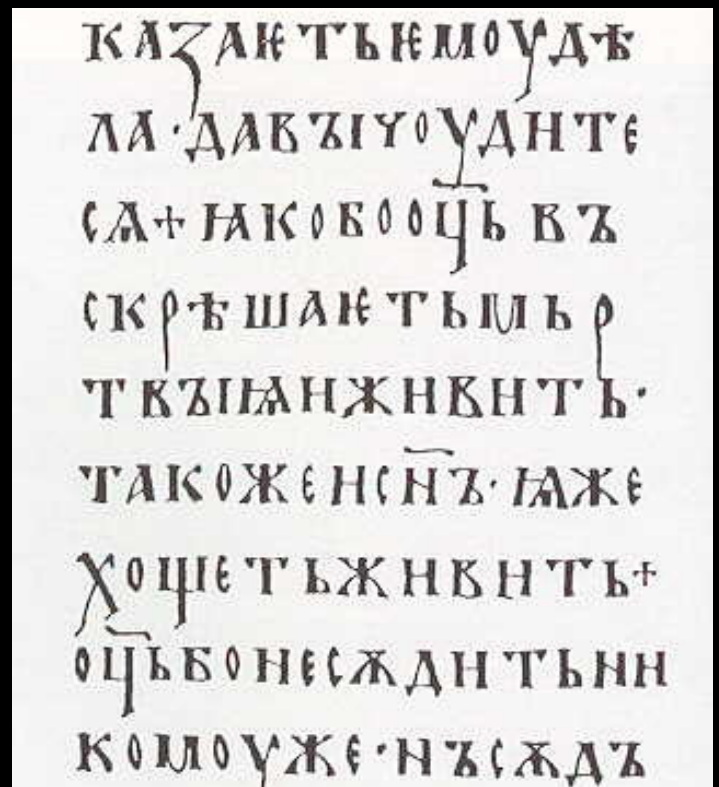
Money

The financial support in the form of pocket money for the mobility period is an amount of 5 EUR per day which includes 2 days of traveling. The amount of money for food is 300 EUR for 59 days. The budget for food will be given every week to all volunteers together. The money for food will be separated into equal parts for each week. Volunteers should cook together and buy food together, thereby being able to prepare more food for themselves.

Useful info

Bulgarian is the official language in the country. The alphabet is the Cyrillic **so you need to get familiar with it prior to your arrival**. You can also remember some important phrases which will be useful. Of course, most young people speak English, at least at a basic level, but keep in mind that people above 40 years old probably will not be able to communicate with you in English, including officers at the ticket desks of train/bus station as well as drivers.

A curious custom: You should be careful when you ask people about the way or something else, because **Bulgarians nod their head for "no", and shake their head for "yes", in contrast with the other parts of Europe**.



How to reach Kazanlak

If you don't have BGN (1 EUR is 2 BGN +/- 0.05), take at least 50 leva from the bank machine (ATM) at the airport because you need money for the transport.

1) From Sofia Airport to the city centre

- Please keep in mind that only Terminal 2 (the newer and bigger one) is connected to the metro line. From Terminal 1 you should take a bus to the city centre or the free airport shuttle to Terminal 2.
- A single ticket in Sofia costs 1.60 BGN for one trip. If you buy a bus ticket from the driver, it will cost 2 BGN. A metro ticket costs 1.60 and can be used even for connections. Please take the metro to Serdika station. Get off there and change the line in direction Central railway station/Centralna gara.

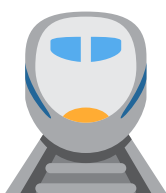


Serdika Station

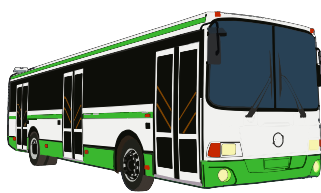
2) From Sofia to Kazanlak

A train is a better option. It travels around 3.30 h and is cheaper. A bus will take you to Kazanlak within 4 hours and the tickets would be almost double as expensive.

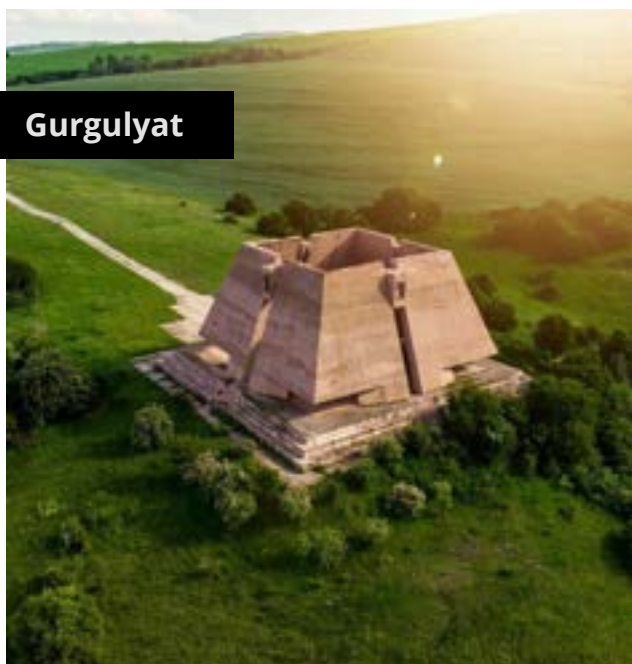
