Hosting organization

"United Avangard Artist" takes part in activities and art forms regarding theater, cinema, photography and music, and also social, volunteer, ecological and community activities. The members always search for new and unusual methods. The organization has won several national awards, including one for the best youth initiative for Kazanlak and an international one from the European Commission for the best short-length movie. In the last years, United Avangard Artist is active with making cinema. The organization makes predominantly shortlength films with great social purposes and themes such as AIDS, drug abuse, ecology, human trafficking, and tolerance. The movie "Tolerance", shows tolerance in different ways and has earned the organization international recognition from the "Fingerprints" contest made by the EU.





Project details:

The project is focused on audiovisual and visual art with social and environmental impact. The volunteers will work together on: Creating short movies. The work will include video editing and filming in cooperation with the local community.

The main activities of the volunteers will be:

- creating short videos that reflect the present situation, eco movies
- shooting and filming
- "acting" or being a model
- creating activities with partners and photo exhibitions
- design and art (creating posters or acting...)
- creating a photo album with art photos that represent topics of the project and more..
- take part to the "Rose festival" 2026 if it's possible
- promoting European Solidarity Corps programme
- Working in the museum that organization has.
- Collecting plastic bottles and caps for a local campaign

Organizing events

The volunteers will regularly work with local institutions like municipality, library, elderly house, daily care center for kids with disabilities and museums to prepare workshops, presentations and other events for the local community. Very popular events are Language cafe or *Bez Pari* (without money), which provides space for the exchange of old clothes, devices, tools, and other things among people without paying for them.

The volunteers will work with professional equipment with the help of experienced mentors. We are searching for creative people with different skills and with experience, who enjoy working as a team on videos, on the website, printed materials, and marketing.



Other projects

The volunteers will participate in projects of other organizations with similar topics and aims. It might be visiting festivals, eco-villages, repairing a historical church, attending a conference, or acting in a fire theater. The activities are varied and you will have many incredible opportunities to try and experience things you wouldn't even think of.



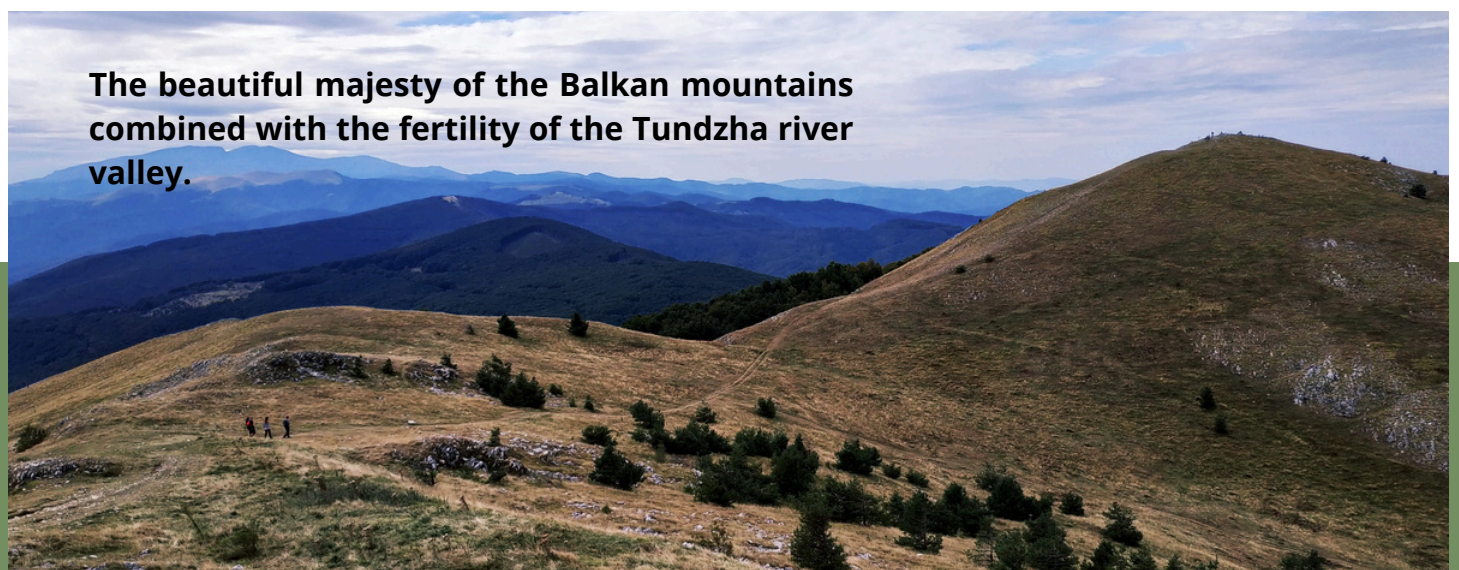
Traveling Bulgaria

About Kazanlak

Also known as Kansas city and Valley of Roses, Kazanlak lies in the geographical center of Bulgaria, 200 km east of Sofia and 108 km northeast of Plovdiv.



The beautiful majesty of the Balkan mountains combined with the fertility of the Tundzha river valley.



Damask Rose is one of the most important natural treasures in the region. Kazanlak, the main center for the production of the Bulgarian rose oil (85% of the world's total), is famous worldwide thanks to this traditional activity that is several centuries long. Rose-picking lasts for about a month (from May 20 to June 20, depending on weather conditions) and it is part of the popular Rose Festival.

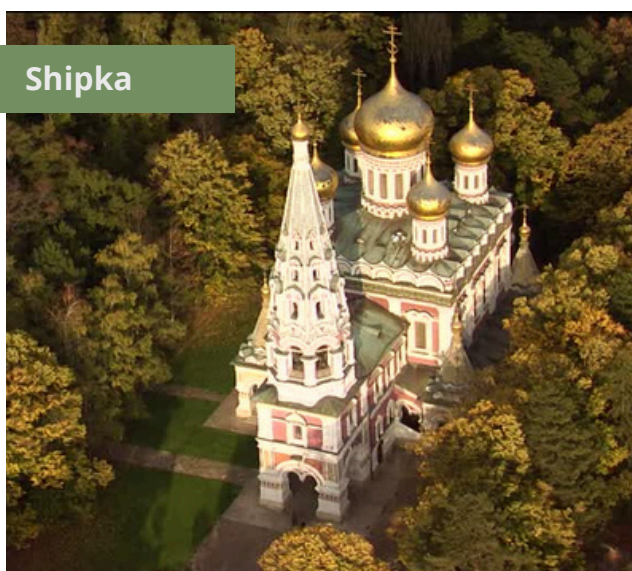


Buzludzha

Kazanlak is among the 15 biggest industrial centers of Bulgaria, also called as city of guns and roses for the Arsenal weapon factory, one of the main employers in the region. The population is around 53.000 people (2024).

Accommodation

All the volunteers will live and share a apartment with another volunteers. There are 2 bedrooms with common bathroom, living room and small kitchen. In case something is damaged or broken, repair costs will be divided jointly by all volunteers.

Travel costs

Travel costs have a limit depending on the volunteer's country (the amount is pre-established and cannot be changed). Keep all the boarding passes and original tickets from your travel!

The money will be reimbursed on your bank account after the end of the project, when the volunteers submit all tickets and fill the final report.

Money

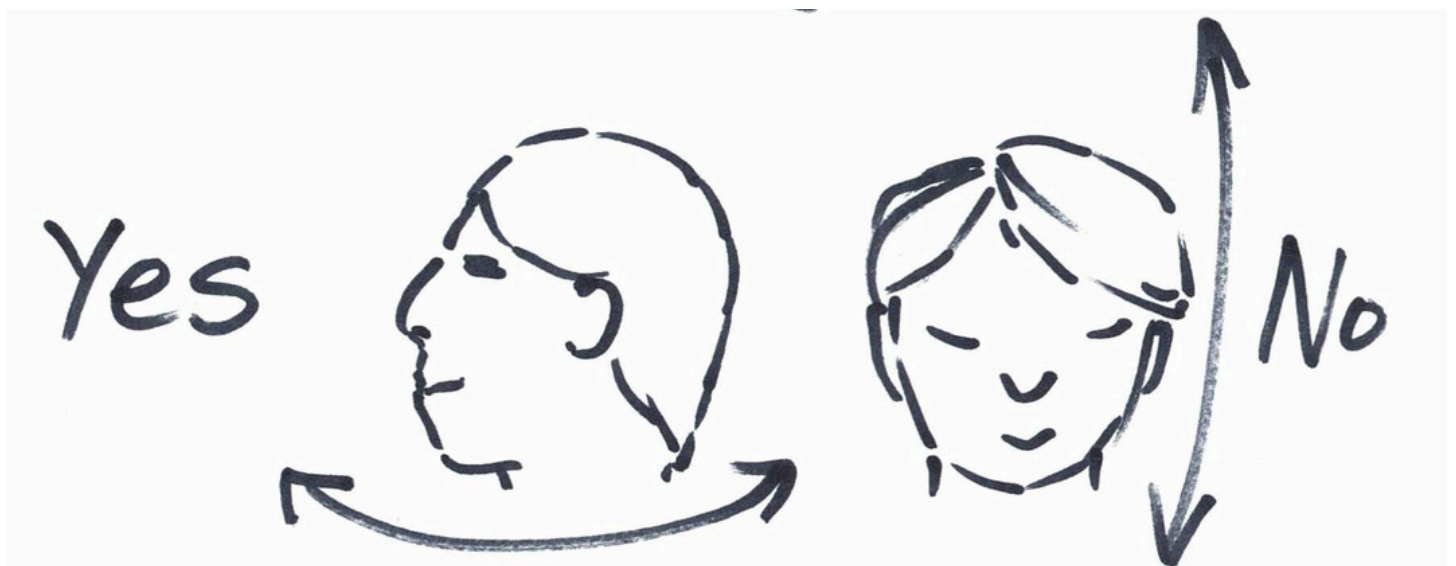
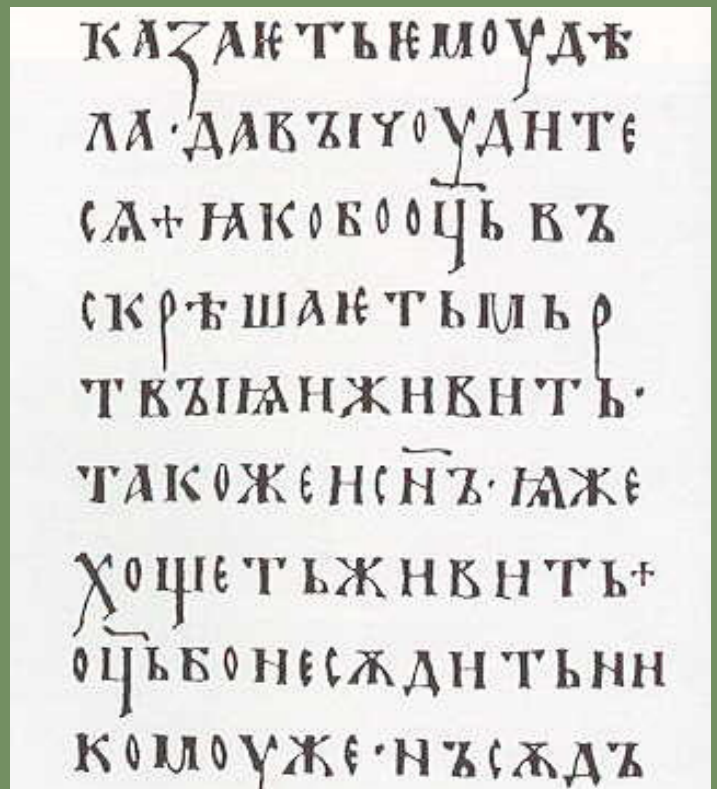
The financial support in the form of pocket money is 7 EUR per day.
The amount of money for food is 150 EUR for a month.

The pocket money will be given to every volunteer on the beginning of every month. The money for food will be provided at the end of every month. The financial support includes weekends, holidays and vacation (20 days for the whole period).

Useful info

Bulgarian is the official language in Bulgaria. The alphabet used is the Cyrillic alphabet so you need to get familiar with it prior to your arrival. You can also remember some important phrases which will be useful. Of course, most young people speak English, at least at a basic level, but keep in mind that people above 50 years old probably will not be able to communicate with you in English, including officers at the ticket desks of train/bus station as well as drivers.

A curious custom: You should be careful when you ask people about the way or something else, because Bulgarians nod their head for “no”, and shake their head for “yes”, in contrast with the other parts of Europe.



How to reach Kazanlak

The official currency of Bulgaria is the EUR, and card payments are generally accepted.

1) From Sofia Airport to the city centre

- Please keep in mind that only Terminal 2 (the newer and bigger one) is connected to the metro line. From Terminal 1 you should take a bus to the city centre or the free airport shuttle to Terminal 2.
- A single ticket in Sofia costs 0.8 EUR for one trip, for more info :

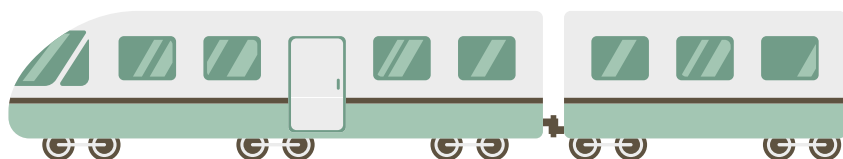

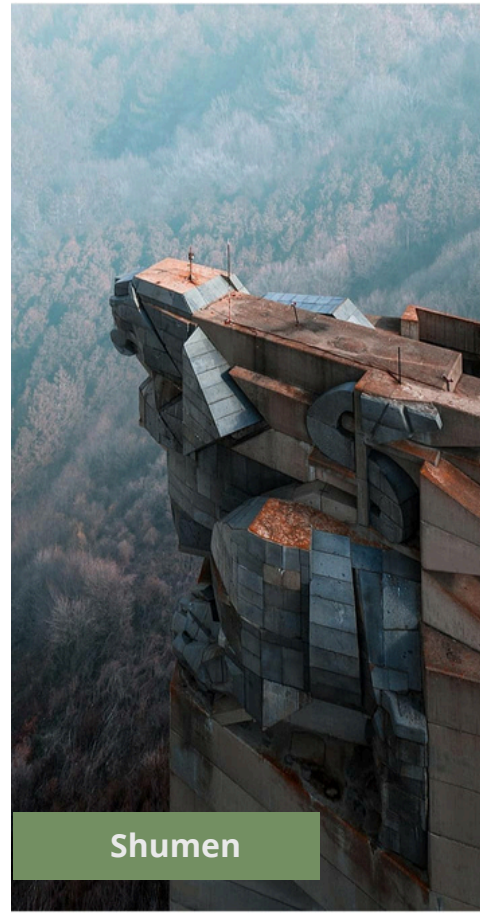
Why Bulgaria?
